OVERVIEW:

The "Road Map to Success" is a training initiative to give every Marine a guideline from which to plan their career. Each MOS Road Map details the MOS Training, PME, Voluntary Education, and Billets recommended for each rank. These Road Maps "should not" be utilized by supervisors for performance evaluation of a Marine such as Proficiency/Conduct Marks or Fitness Reports, but as an option to enhance their future both in the military and beyond.

Upon graduation from MOS school, Marine receives a brief on:

Future MOS courses, MCI requirements, PME requirements, and the availability of college courses.
