

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
U.S. ARMY ORDNANCE CENTER AND SCHOOL,
U.S. ARMY TRAINING AND DOCTRINE COMMAND,
AND
U.S. MARINE CORPS COMBAT DEVELOPMENT COMMAND**

**SUBJECT: U.S. Army and U.S. Marine Corps Fire Control Repairer
and Electro-Optical Repair Consolidated Courses at U.S. Army
Ordnance Center and School**

1. REFERENCE:

- a. AR 351-9, OPNAVINST 1500.27D, AFR 50-18, MCO 1580.7C, Interservice Training.
- b. Interservice Training Review Organization Procedures Manual, ITRO Training Management Analysis Committee, January 1995.
- c. AR 350-10, Management of Army Individual Training Requirements and Resources.
- d. TRADOC Reg 350-70, Training Development Management, Processes and Products.

2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to define the roles of the U.S. Army Ordnance Center and School (USAOC&S), Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland; the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), Fort Monroe, Virginia; and the U.S. Marine Corps Combat Development Command (MCCDC), Quantico, Virginia, concerning the following consolidated courses:

- U.S. Army 45G10 Fire Control Repairer
- U.S. Marine Corps 2171 Electro-Optical Repair

3. PROBLEM: To specify guidelines, channels of command, control, and coordination attendant to performing host/tenant support responsibilities.

4. SCOPE: This MOU delineates responsibilities and procedures for the conduct of the consolidated 45G10 Fire Control Repairer and 2171 Electro-Optical courses between USAOC&S and MCCDC. Included in its scope are course design, program of instruction (POI) modification, training, and the support needed to accomplish this training. This MOU will be further supplemented by an Interservice Support Agreement (ISA).

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5. TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

a. Administration.

(1) The U.S. Army will:

(a) Coordinate and develop standards of academic requirements with the USMC.

(b) Coordinate any administrative or academic policy changes which affect Marine Corps personnel with the Commanding Officer (CO), Marine Corps Detachment (MCD), or designated representative.

(c) Act as host for the consolidated 2171 Electro-Optical instruction/training taught at USAOC&S and provide the following:

1. Barracks and dining facilities that will support the student and permanent party population and that allow the MCD CO to maintain unit integrity.

2. Administrative space for the MCD CO and staff.

3. Instructor Training Course (ITC) certification and faculty development courses, as agreed, plus participation in any established instructor recognition program.

4. Appropriate shared facilities to support USMC inter-service and unique training as agreed. This includes administrative space, records control and processing, and access to classrooms, training areas, and e-mail system.

5. Transportation support to training locations not within reasonable walking/marching distance.

(d) Coordinate with USMC to determine annual training requirement/quotas during the Department of the Army Structure Manning Decision Review (SMDR) process as defined in AR 350-10, Management of Army Individual Training Requirements and Resources.

(e) Assist U.S. Army Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM) in their preparation of training requirement analysis system (TRAS) documents in accordance with TRADOC Regulation 350-70 for submission to TRADOC.

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(2) The U.S. Marine Corps Combat Development Command and the Marine Corps Detachment Aberdeen Proving Ground will:

(a) Coordinate personnel administrative functions in support of students directly with the USAOC&S.

(b) Establish and maintain an MCD subordinate to the Director, Training and Education Division, MCCDC. USMC students attending the course and permanent personnel will be assigned to the MCD, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Maryland. The MCD CO is the spokesman for MCCDC and will exercise all authority associated with command including, but not limited to, administrative control, pay, legal, and training matters.

(c) Conform to local U.S. Army policies and standard operating procedures in all instances except where they are in direct conflict with USMC regulations. These conflicts will be resolved between MCD CO and USAOC&S officials.

(d) Furnish the estimated training requirements projected by fiscal year to the Army SMDR (if applicable) in time to be included in the proper financial planning cycle, but NLT 1 March.

(e) The Marine Corps shall retain non-judicial punishment and courts-martial jurisdiction over all Marine Corps personnel assigned to the detachment or undergoing instruction at the host training location.

(f) Assist CASCOM and USAOC&S in the analysis, design, development, and evaluation of consolidated training; provide subject matter experts as required to support related training requirements.

b. Concept of Operations: The POI for the consolidated courses is a joint responsibility of all participating services. The U.S. Army is responsible for the physical maintenance of the POI. Any changes to the POI will be fully staffed among all affected services and mutually agreed upon prior to incorporation into the formal curriculum.

(1) The U.S. Army will:

(a) Provide instructor personnel who are technically qualified to share proportionately in consolidated instruction as determined in accordance with Interservice Training Review Organization (ITRO) Manpower Analysis Procedures.

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(b) Provide appropriate instruction, equipment, and facilities to support consolidated training as required by the jointly-approved POI and training schedule. Depending on resource restraints, these facilities may be shared among the services.

(c) Coordinate with the USMC to establish uniform academic recycle and release policies. Administrative recycles and release of USMC students enrolled in the consolidated courses will be coordinated among MCD and the USAOC&S training department.

(d) Provide training materials/training aids and associated organizational maintenance costs, personnel and parts required to support Marine Corps students in consolidated training.

(e) Assign USMC instructors in consolidated courses to positions commensurate with their rank and experience.

(f) Ensure that additional duties within the USAOC&S training department are assigned proportionately to USA and USMC instructors, to include cleanup of training areas.

(g) Coordinate only minor training issues and POI changes with the MCD prior to implementation. However, changes involving training tasks and funding matters must be addressed to the MCD for validation and forwarded to the CG MCCDC (C461) for approval.

(h) Ensure U.S. Army instructors serve normal stabilized tours to meet mutually agreed upon instructor requirements; provide timely replacements to the maximum extent possible.

(i) Ensure U.S. Army instructors meet standards of performance and personal and professional conduct required by their assigned service.

(j) Coordinate with MCD any deviation from USAOC&S established training schedules; for example, evening or weekend training, instruction during local training holidays, or during Exodus.

(2) The U.S. Marine Corps Combat Development Command and the Marine Corps Detachment Aberdeen Proving Ground will:

(a) Provide instructor personnel to share proportionately in consolidated instruction as determined in accordance with ITRO Manpower Analysis Procedures.

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(b) Provide USMC instructor personnel who are technically qualified and fully integrate them into the instructional element.

(c) Ensure USMC instructors serve normal stabilized tours to meet mutually agreed upon instructor requirements; provide timely replacements to the maximum extent possible.

(d) Ensure USMC instructors meet standards of performance and personal and professional conduct required by their assigned service.

(e) Coordinate with USAOC&S training department on scheduled leave/pass for USMC instructors teaching consolidated courses.

(f) Assign additional duties as required to instructors to support USMC functions.

(g) Coordinate with training department any actions to change USMC-unique training materials and equipment requirements; provide an assessment of required facilities.

(h) Coordinate with USAOC&S training department any deviations from USAOC&S established training schedules; for example, evening or weekend training, instruction during local training holidays, or during Exodus.

(i) Assign additional duties to instructor personnel as required to support USAOC&S and/or USMC functions, to include cleanup of training areas within the USAOC&S training department.

(j) Provide materials and equipment/training aids and associated maintenance costs, personnel, and parts required for the unique portion of consolidated courses.

6. FUNDING:

a. For new training, USA will advise the USMC in writing of the anticipated funding requirements. Operation and Maintenance (O&M) funding requirements will include both mission and base support for all consolidated training.

b. Funds to transfer will be based upon amounts approved by the ITRO, Executive Board. Funding will be provided to the USA by using Military Interdepartmental Purchase Requests (MIPRS) until Program Budget Decisions (PBOS) realign interdepartmental funding.

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c. After PBDs have accomplished interdepartmental transfers, any additional Budget Base Transfers (BBTs) that are required as a result of changes in mission/training requirements caused by the USMC will be initiated by the USA. If USMC desires immediate changes in mission/training requirements, it will provide USA with interim funding through a MIPR until a PBD can be processed.

d. USA and USMC will effect an Interservice Support Agreement (ISA) as the basis for any reimbursements, funding, and equipment transfers. The ISA should be annually updated.


7. **TERMS OF UNDERSTANDING:** This MOU will become effective upon date of last signature, and will remain so unless cancelled by mutual agreement, by operation of rule or regulation, or because of national security requirements. The terms of this MOU may be reviewed and supplemented, as required, by mutual consent, provided such changes are accomplished by written agreement and attached hereto. Each party agrees to conduct an annual review of this MOU on its anniversary date.

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
