MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN  
U.S. ARMY TRANSPORTATION AND AVIATION LOGISTICS  
SCHOOLS, FORT EUSTIS, VIRGINIA  
HEADQUARTERS TRAINING AND DOCTRINE COMMAND, FORT MONROE, VA

AND

AIR TRAINING COMMAND, RANDOLPH AFB, TEXAS

AND

CHIEF OF NAVAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING  
NAS PENSACOLA, FLORIDA

AND

DIRECTOR, TRAINING AND EDUCATION CENTER  
MARINE CORPS COMBAT DEVELOPMENT COMMAND  
QUANTICO, VIRGINIA

1. Purpose: The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to identify the responsibilities of the four services in the operation of the consolidated Passenger Travel Specialist (PTS) Course.
2. Reference: AR 351-9, OPNAVINST 1500.27D, AFR 50-18, MCO 1580.73, Interservice Training.
3. Scope: This MOU delineates responsibilities and procedures of the host and participating services in the consolidation and conduct of the PTS course.
4. Terms and Conditions:
  - a. General.
    - (1) The PTS Course is a jointly developed and approved four service course for which the Army will serve as the host service.
    - (2) Instructor staffing will be determined in accordance with applicable Interservice Training Review Organization (ITRO) manpower formula. Manpower issues will be resolved by the ITRO Manpower Subcommittee.
    - (3) Participating service allocations to the course will be coordinated by their respective training management activities through the United States Army Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC) Schools Branch.

(4) The course will be taught at Fort Eustis, Virginia with additional classes conducted at the Navy Transportation School, Oakland Army Base, California, by a mobile training team. All costs associated with the mobile training team will be funded by the requesting service. However, in the event the student input is from several agencies, the requesting service may request funding assistance from those agencies.

b. Administration.

(1) The Army will serve as host service for the course.

(2) The Headquarters, Military Traffic Management Command (HQMTMC) will serve as the Technical Advisor.

(3) Periodic meetings will be held between representatives of the host and participating services and HQMTMC to review the course in general and to ensure course currency.

(4) The U.S. Army Transportation School at Fort Eustis, Virginia, as the host school, will be responsible for overall curriculum content and course management in coordination with the participating services.

(5) Administrative, billeting, and classroom spaces for students and permanent party will be provided as required by the U.S. Army Transportation School.

(6) The Air Force, Navy, and Marine Corps will share in the funding of any additional instructors if required by the consolidation of the PTS as determined by the ITRO Manpower Subcommittee procedures.


(7) Disposition of Recycles and Failures: Recycling or elimination of students for academic or administrative reasons will be in accordance with USATALS Memorandum 350-15 and the student evaluation plan. These actions will be coordinated with the student's parent service.

5. TERMS OF UNDERSTANDING: Terms of this MOU become effective upon signature by all parties and may be revised and supplemented by mutual consent, provided such changes are accomplished by written agreements and are attached hereto. Provisions of this agreement will be reviewed annually on the anniversary date.






